

CCN Background 2023 CCN Task Force Report

Goal of this legislated solution

- AB 1111 (2021) required the California Community Colleges develop and implement a student-facing common course numbering system.
- Vision of system-level articulation from CCCs to universities using CCN Course Templates. Focus on streamlining transfer by creating conditions for seamless articulation (system-to system and course-to-course)
 - Common transferability
 - Common GE applicability
 - Consistent course to course articulation
 - Potential for more consistent major prep articulation

CCN is Student-Facing

Timeline Expansion for CCN Implementation

On or before July 1, 2024 (2027), the following is to occur:

- The CCCs shall adopt a CCN system for all GE and transfer pathway requirement courses
- The CCN system shall be student facing and ensure that comparable CCC courses have the same course number
- Phased approach to CCN Template development in bands or course clusters

Course Type Identifier

A system level key could be developed to define other identifiers or establish local use parameters. C = Common Course Number

0XXX - Non-baccalaureate

1XXX - 100-level course

2XXX - 200-level course

3XXX - 300-level course

4XXX - 400 level course

9XXX - Non-credit

Provides for 1000 courses at each level per discipline per identifier type.

Other levels could be defined at the system-level as needs are identified.

Course Speciality Identifier (&&&)

A system-level key could define options: (examples)

H = Honors Course

L = Lab only Course

O = Combined Lecture/Lab Course

R= Co-Requisite only Course

D= Co-Requisite and Credit Course

Impacts & Implications

- Local curriculum & catalog processes are already impacted by Cal-GETC, ADT, GE, and AB 1705 changes and more. CCCs are already under stress with Curriculum work.
- CCN requires a shift from complete COR college autonomy to a degree of intentional alignment and similarity needed for system-level articulation needed for students.
- Vision depends on UC and CSU changes to current articulation processes.
 - Course to course and major preparation consideration
 - CSUCO and UCOP continue have been asked to seek feedback among their institutions about major prep and course-to-course articulation of commonly numbered courses
 - Colleges may add information to the CCN COR they deem necessary to maintain current articulation with individual UC and CSU campuses. Note: This can only be added in areas where the CCN template allows for optional and expanded information.
- There will be implementation impacts on people, technology, and local processes
