Guided Lab~ Who Wrote This? Addressing AI-Assisted Cheating with Turnitin Clarity

Worried that AI is making it easier for students to bypass authentic writing? This workshop will introduce faculty to Turnitin Clarity, Turnitin's new AI-supported writing and transparency platform designed to provide insight into the student writing process. You will learn how to create Clarity assignments right in Canvas and use settings with a range of options including to what degree students are allowed to use an AI helper (or none at all) adding instructions, rubrics, etc. as you normally do. Participants will also see how these tools can support students in demonstrating and defending their authorship, giving them a clear record of their writing process to validate their work when questions arise. Learn how the platform was implemented in a summer college course, including successes, challenges, and student reactions to writing in an AI-transparent environment.
