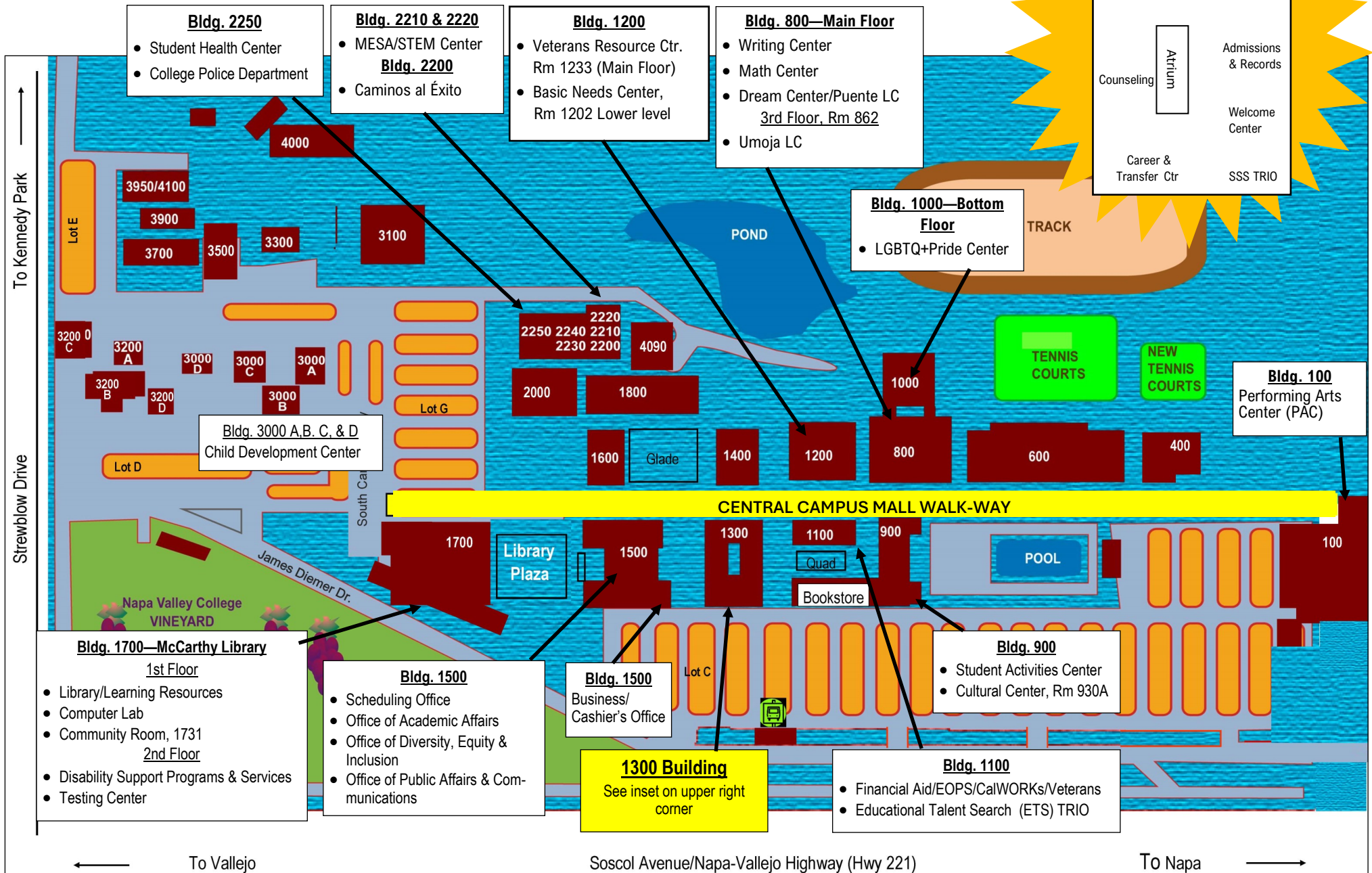

Educational Talent Search TRIO

Extended Opportunity Program and Services (EOPS)/CalWORKs/CARE

A state-funded program providing academic, transfer, and career support; tutoring services. CARE is a supplemental component of EOPS for single parents receiving public assistance; CalWORKs supports parenting students with children under 18; provides supportive referral services

Student Health Center

Free to students: diagnosis and treatment of illnesses, first aid, TB, birth control, pregnancy testing; STD screening and treatment; and mental health services (covered by the Student Health Fee)

Student Support Services (SSS) TRIO

Provides academic, retention, transfer and graduation support for first-generation and low-income students, and students with disabilities; includes advising, tutoring, tours, transfer information, financial literacy and scholarship assistance.

Testing Center

Provides placement testing into English, math and ESL classes; accommodations for test administration to students with disabilities; make-up exams, GED testing, distance ed proctoring and tutoring services
